The government Covid-19 catch-up premium has been given to schools to mitigate the effects of the unique disruption caused by coronavirus. This grant is only available for the 2020-21 academic year. The money will be used for two main areas. The bulk will be spent on specific academic interventions with small groups of students, targeting those who have been worst affected by the pandemic. Smaller sums will be directed towards wellbeing for the whole community and to address some of the behavioral concerns which have arisen.
